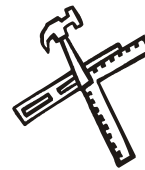

Introduction to SpellWell

You have 30 lessons in the two SpellWell books. Each lesson has four activities to complete throughout the week. Each word list has 15 SpellWell words and 1-2 outlaw words, with room for a few individualized words that your student needs to know or has trouble with. (You do not NEED to add words to the list, some are provided for you at the bottom of each page if needed.) The test for each lesson is scheduled on the fifth day, but this could be changed for a four-day schedule.

Handwriting Pages

Handwriting is not scheduled for every day, but space is provided for you to check it off when you complete it. We recommend you purchase plain handwriting paper or use some of the reproducible forms found in your guidebook.

What to do for needed additional handwriting practice? Look for a comprehensive list of ideas in the introductory notes of this program guide. Do not feel you must practice handwriting every day, as quite a bit is required in the other workbooks.

Introduction to Cursive Handwriting With a Twist!

Before teaching your student cursive (or continuing with his instruction, if he's worked on cursive before), **be sure to read the introductory pages 4-6**, which explains some of the meanings of the mnemonic devices employed by this author. She groups letters by giving each set a name, such as mountain climbers, which have uphill beginnings. You will want to understand these names so that you can stress the names of the groups to your student throughout the year. This will help prevent your student from mixing up letter forms.

Paragraph Writing Made Easy Assignments

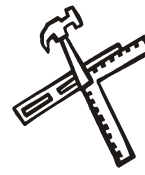
Discussion - Go over page 7 with your student
