




How Do I Use Ebook Versions?



This resource is easy to print looseleaf, and can be printed as many times as you like for multiple students, offering you a great savings. By having access to this file, you can customize and print only those pages you'll use, which is especially handy if you have younger students, or student who would rather focus on other aspects of the program. Either way, your students are using it the same way in print or ebook. This is a resource that is in color, but it can be printed in black and white if you preferred.

An Unfurling Sail

You've probably already discovered a lot about this book. This book is handy to have in ebook format, since you can transfer it to devices each of your students use. They will be referencing this book a lot during their year, and using it to independently to verify facts or complete their "Make-Your-Own" Captain's Log. They'll enjoy having their own copy on their device, and you'll appreciate not having to share one copy among several students. Plus, students will enjoy seeing many of the illustrations in color.



Under the Sea & In the Air

In ebook format, we give you a complete student text that includes both reading sections and student worksheets in one file, and just the student worksheets in another file. The complete text is meant to be viewed and not printed (but it is an option if you would like). You can choose to do this, and print a complete text for each student, and not view anything. On the other hand, the student worksheet file is created so you can easily print the worksheets looseleaf, and print it as many times as you want. Students can read the reading sections from the viewable text, then complete their worksheets on paper. In addition, this file makes it easy to customize what you are having each student do, and enables you to have younger students completing just select assignments, if you wish. The complete text is 94 pages; the student worksheets are just 49 pages (taken from that 94).

The God of All Creation


Students will work with this book as a devotional a few minutes each day. This resource is consumable, unless you have your student complete the work in a separate journal. You may print as many copies as you like with your ebook set. You can print looseleaf pages, OR student can view and write answers in journal or notebook. If you print, you'll be printing 103 looseleaf pages.

Young Learners Guidebook

In digital format, this resource can easily be printed in its entirety, or you can view the introductory material and print the scheduling pages. They can be printed looseleaf in black and white. The entire guidebook is 48 pages long; 36 of these pages are weekly schedules.

Older Learners Guide Pages

This resource offers Independent Study Schedule pages your older learner will substitute for those in the main Sea and Sky guide. Each page offers not only assignments from the basic program, but also assignments from additional resources that add content. This guide also offers different projects that your student can choose to do or not to do. These project ideas are created with the older learner in mind. In digital format, this resource can easily be printed in its entirety, or you can view the introductory material and print the Independent Study Schedule pages. They can be printed looseleaf in black and white. It is helpful to note that in digital, we send you a version that includes fillable forms so that students or parents can add other assignments, such as math or language arts, to keep the student on track with all their work. The entire guidebook is 85 pages long; 36 of these pages are the Independent Study Schedules.
